Academic Advisement Q&As

Q: What is degreeworks?

A: Degreeworks is the degree audit tool that SUNY Oneonta uses. Degreeworks keeps track of your degree requirements and credits, GPA, courses that you still need to take to fufill you major requirements, and also lists any courses that you may have withdrawn from.

Courses that you have completed are indicated on Degreeworks by a green check mark, a blue half circle marks a required class that you currently In progress of taking, and an open red circle means a requirement has not been met yet.

Degree works also has a "what-if" tool to see what requirements need to be met If you are looking to change or add your major/program!

A: There are many intramural teams and club sports offered for students, such as club golf, club baseball and intramural soccer and basketball teams. More Information and teams are available on campus connection.






Q: How do I find out more about Greek Life? A: You can reach out to Greek life organizations through campus connection, or their Instagram pages

Q: I need help with studying, can the SLC help me? A: Yes! The SLC offers resources to help with studying and staying on task







Internships & job opportunities
